Dear Prayer Partners,

The Jewish holiday of Shavuot is a celebration of God's gift of Torah on Mount Sinai and includes the wheat harvest celebration. This year's observance was May 21-23. It is one of the three biblical pilgrimage feasts held in Jerusalem. Traditions include an all-night Torah study and of course, festive foods which include some dairy-based dishes such as Challah bread (which is sweet and braided before baking), blintzes (stuffed with various cheese fillings), and cheesecakes. The intent is to highlight biblical references to Israel as a "land flowing with milk and honey." Regional recipes reflect the areas where this observance is held, such as Sephardic, Middle Eastern and Ashkenazi variations. The holiday is to symbolize purity, abundance and the sweetness of the Torah. There is a reverence and intentional celebration for God's gift of the scriptures, which we can appreciate as believers.

Our tract outreach continues to expand. We are now sending the "What Does Messiah Look Like" tract to the Phoenix area. There is quite a large Jewish community there and some do not appreciate the message of the tract. One lady recently wrote, "This letter is to advise you to never send mail to us again. If you have money to spend on sending this you don't need a donation. If I ever get mail from this organization again I will sue!" It's quite interesting that she assumed this was a fundraising effort while disregarding the message of Messiah. She also said, "Hit up all the Jews in New Jersey and New York." Please keep praying that God keeps working in the hearts of those who receive the tracts. We are thankful for the continued help from the volunteers all over the country who address envelopes and pray for each person who receives the tract. As of this week, we have mailed 211,000 tracts! This is so amazing!

I hope you will be okay with my writing the prayer letter this week as Al is in full blown sinus infection status right now. If he wrote the letter now, I would have to rewrite it because it wouldn't make much sense!
